

Program Overview

The Korean Studies Summer Program (KSSP) offers international students from around the world an exciting opportunity to learn about Korea and its culture during the summer. The goal of the program is to guide each participant into a total experience of the rich and dynamic Korean culture in historical and contemporary social contexts. KSSP will be hosted at Hannam University, a small campus located in Daejeon, South Korea. During the first three weeks of the program, participants will complete a course focused on Korean language and culture. In the fourth week of the program, students will complete a Teaching Practicum where they will teach English to elementary school students.

Academics

Students who participate in this program will earn 3 credits in Korean Studies. The KSSP program offers students an excellent opportunity to learn about Korean language and culture. Students will also participate in a Teaching Practicum where they gain professional experience and earn 3 additional credits. This type of cross-cultural experience will be highly beneficial to participants' cultivation of global citizenship.
