

Program Overview

The Language Center at the Universidad de Valladolid offers training in Spanish language and culture, from A1 to C2 level (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) during the academic year Spanish courses are offered for students of A1, A2, B1, B2 and C1 levels so students can improve their command of the Spanish language and gain an understanding of the culture of Spanish society.

Academics

The Language Center is equipped with state-of-the-art technology in language learning. There is also a language lab and a multimedia room as well as a meeting room for students offering free-access computers and free Wi-Fi in all the campus facilities. Students will take a language placement test to determine what level of Spanish they will take. Classes range from level A1 (beginner) to C1 (advanced).
