Program Overview

The University of East Anglia (UEA) has been rated as one of the best universities for student experience in the Times Higher Education Student Experience Survey 2015. They are currently 6th out of all UK universities, and have placed in the top six since the survey began. They are an internationally renowned university based in a campus that boasts top quality academic, social and cultural facilities.

Academics

UEA is ranked in the top 1% of universities in the world and is consistently in the top ten for student satisfaction. They are a leading member of Norwich Research Park, one of Europe's biggest concentrations of researchers in the fields of environment, health, and plant science. Students may choose from a variety of courses such as arts, business, communication, economics, education, history, international studies, law, literature, drama, creative writing, psychology, and science.

Student Life

Sporting facilities on campus include the University Sportspark which houses an Olympic-sized swimming pool and regularly hosts international sporting events. UEA also has the world famous Sainsbury Centre for Visual Arts and hosts an International Literary Festival which has included famous names such as Ian McEwan, Kazuo Ishiguro and Anne Enright (all alumni of UEA's Creative Writing course).

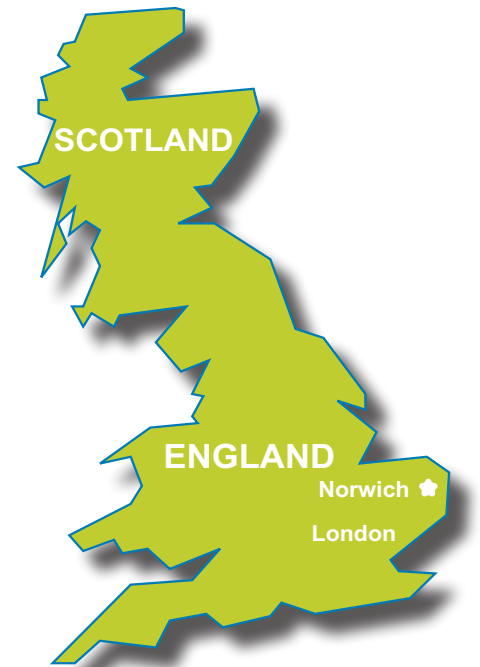


Surrounding Area

Since Norwich is a relatively small city, it is easy for students to get to know the area. There are many transport links connecting the university and the rest of Norwich, including bus routes, cycle lanes, and tree-lined walkways. It is also a short journey by train from London and Cambridge. Norwich itself has many historical sites as well as parks, a nature reserve, theatres and museums.

Housing

Housing availability on campus is limited. Accommodation in all University residences is self-catering (for example, no meal plan). Each residence contains several fully-furnished, centrally-heated, single-occupancy rooms grouped with a shared kitchen/living space. Kitchens come equipped with a fridge, freezer and oven or microwave and residents provide their own cooking utensils, crockery and cutlery. Students also provide their own linens, or alternatively, bedding packs can be purchased from the Accommodation Office.
