Saitama is the capitol and most populous city in the Saitama Prefecture. Situated 9-18 miles north of Tokyo, Saitama offers easy access to the excitement and bustling streets of Tokyo. In Saitama itself, there are museums, parks, historical buildings, and shrines where students can experience the city's culture and history.

Housing

Students will choose between staying in the Japan Foundation Japanese-Language Institute, Urawa (off-campus dormitory), which does not provide meals and is a 30 minute commute to Saitama University, or a homestay with a Japanese family, whichprovides meals but is a 60 minute commute to the university.
